Leanne will be continuing with us until at least the end of 2022, for which we are very grateful!

Sally Douglas was excellent as presenter on "Church as Salt" and around 25 people participated in various parts of the program. We very much enjoyed her presence among us.

After a short break since School of Ministry, Christine and I are back on deck at CEDAL. Elaine Ledgerwood has now finished up with us in lay education and is awaiting placement for ministry as a Deacon. In the interim we hope to have some volunteer assistance in training lay leaders and those candidating for lay preacher.

I am excited to announce that the Pilgrimage to Israel is now scheduled for 1–14th February, 2023 and is definitely going to proceed and we are seeking any more who would like to be included in this venture. We have five candidates and early graduates coming along. This will be a transformational experience in terms of understanding not just geography of Israel, but also looking at archeological evidence for various sites, and engaging in conversation and observation of the current political context. Israel is a place of great complexity and also of fascination: from the dead sea scrolls to seeing Herodium and the place where King Herod's tomb was exhumed and now on display in the Jerusalem museum; to climbing the heights of Masada, the place of the Jewish rebels' last stand against Rome. It's all fabulous food for the soul. The Candidates will be supported in part by scholarship from the Tabitha Trust.

Back to more immediate matters:

Looking ahead I draw to your attention the Second **Basis of Union** Day 2 (5th August). Please let me know as soon as possible if you would like to attend.

Another day of training for Lay Presiders in Sacraments will be held on Friday 26th August.

Australian Colonial History and Culture (27–29th July) will be a course suited to those particularly from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse background or seeking AOM and introduces not only some history of our colonial history but also seeks to introduce topics such as feminism in Australia, and contemporary youth culture, and some anthropological understanding of indigenous history. Geof Lilburne and I have

now run this program twice previously and attendees have found it very helpful as an introduction to our cultural identities.

Terence Corkin will be joining us for training in **congregational dynamics** towards the end of the year on 14–16th November. He will be teaching days on the topics of: Day 1: understanding and responding to conflict, Day 2: working together well and Day 3: leading through change.

We look to the future of our church with hope. We aspire to bring the church into the 21st century with creativity and a contemporary mission focus. We pray for God to raise up leaders for the future of our church.

We aim to encourage, engage and empower as we work together.

Preventing and Responding to Family Violence: A Faith Leader's Practice Guide and Toolkit



Written by Manal Shehab (Sisters4Sisters Support Services) with support from WIRE and other famiy violence specialist organisations, including consultation with members from Victoria's diverse faith communities, the Faith Leader's Practice Guide and Toolkit shares the best of Australian and international research evidence on the factors that cause and reinforce family violence in faith communities.

The resource draws from the evidence produced by the National Research Organisation for Women's Safety (ANROWS), affiliate researchers, and strategies from specialist CALD and LGBTQIA+ family violence organisations. It also uses the 'Change the Story framework' of Our Watch, the national organisation leading the

primary prevention of violence against women and their children in Australia. It is also informed by the wealth of good work already practiced in diverse faith communities in Australia and across the globe.

WA Disaster Recovery Chaplaincy Network

The Council of Churches WA, in partnership with the WA Synod of the Uniting Church, is offering training in Disaster Recovery Chaplaincy 9–10 August 2022, Refresher Disaster Recovery Chaplaincy 10 August 2022, and Peer Support on 11 August 2022. This is open to ministry agents and lay people who have qualifications and experience in the caring professions to assist in the recovery of communities following disasters and emergencies within the state. In 2019 the WA Disaster Recovery Chaplaincy Network was established with an initial group of 51 people being trained. This statewide network of pastoral carers can engage with the community and churches following a disaster or emergency as affected communities seek to establish new

beginnings.

Similar networks operate through every state and territory in Australia, and all are aligned to a national body known as AVECA (Australian Volunteer Emergency Chaplaincy Alliance). AVECA is a network of the National Council of Churches in Australia (NCCA). It is anticipated that the WA DRCN will be incorporated in the State Disaster Welfare arrangements and, even in its infancy, already has representation on AVECA.

A two-day training course will take place on 9 and 10 August 2022. This training is useful for ministers, chaplains and lay people who have qualifications and experience in the caring professions and covers the following units:

AUGUST 9 AND 10 – DISASTER RECOVERY CHAPLAINCY (2 DAYS FOR NEW PARTICIPANTS)

- Unit 1 Introductions;
- Unit 2 The Nature of Chaplaincy in Crisis;
- Unit 3 The Nature of Disaster and Emerging Issues;
- Unit 4 Human Needs and Development;
- Unit 5 Overview of Trauma Response;
- Unit 6 Skills in Caring for Traumatised People;
- Unit 7 The Practise of Disaster Recovery Chaplaincy;
- Unit 8 DR Chaplains' Code of Ethics and Guiding Principles

AUGUST 10 – DISASTER RECOVERY CHAPLAINCY (1 DAY - REFRESHER)

WA DRCN Chaplains are required to attend a refresher training every three years from when they have been accredited. Attending this day will add three new years to your accreditation.

AUGUST 11 – PEER SUPPORT TRAINING: (1 DAY)

This day trains pastoral carers to care for other pastoral carers in disaster, emergency, and crisis situations. It is useful in understanding the dynamics for ministers in disaster situations and strategies in caring for and equipping them in the recovery phase.

The three days of training course will accrue 21 hours of Professional Development. Ministers will obtain training points for Continuing Education/Professional Development and Certificates will be issued on completion.

WHO MAY APPLY?

DRCN chaplains are ministry agents or lay people who have qualifications and experience in the caring professions from a range of faith organisations who are ordained or equivalent, are employed in institutional chaplaincy (e.g., Hospital, Gaol, Aged Care) or have qualifications and experience in the caring professions. Those applying must have the support of their denomination or faith body for involvement.

WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

There is no cost associated with the training.

This course will develop theological reflection skills for the supervision context, gaining facility in at least two different models of reflection.

Who can come? All ministry agents under pastoral supervision with two years experience in ministry.

Lay and ordained ministry agents who are in a pastoral relationship with those in their communities, and who care for them with spiritual care or support. They have a particular place in the community, with responsibility to ensure that they embody integrity, trust and compassion in their relationships.

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Lay Presiders Sacraments Refresher Day

It's a question that needs to be asked. What is the difference between experiencing a sacrament, such as Holy Communion, as opposed to sharing a snack? Is it simply having the right words or the right set of hands or is there something deeper than this?

Sacraments, in the Protestant tradition, are instituted by Jesus in our Gospels. However, they provide a powerful connection to God in a tangible way. When we speak of the real presence of Christ in Holy Communion, we are neither speaking of a literal presence or simply a memorial meal. In the sacrament of Holy Communion, we encounter the risen Christ in a unique way. Similarly in the sacrament of Baptism we are enacting the truth of God's grace. In both cases we are leading people through an experience of the sacred in a way that connects to all our senses.

This workshop is a requirement for anyone whose recognition as a lay presider expires this year.

Ongoing Training

ACD Certificate IV & Diploma
