Coming up in lay education:

Looking ahead I draw to your attention the **Basis of Union Day 2** is on (5th August). Please let me know as soon as possible if you would like to attend.

In the lay education space, there will be further **lay sacraments training** later in the year **and another round of Basis of Union Day 1**, for those who missed out earlier in the year and need to complete this for their commissioning as Pastors.

Church council training days

Church council training is a chance for your council to think about the very basics of what the regulations require of councils – that is, Spiritual oversight and pastoral care; building up the congregation in faith and love, sustaining its members in hope, and leading them into a fuller participation in Christ's mission in the world.

The course runs over Friday night and Saturday and helps each group of leaders think through core elements of oversight, such as having language to talk about spirituality, to think about relationships and talking about difficult topics, having a theological viewpoint, and what might be involved in being missional in the congregation.

It is best to have a minimum of three council members from each council to gain the most from this programme.

The course will run in Busselton on 26th and 27th of August; other southwest region councils are welcome to join.

Ministers and Pastors, especially those transitioning to be part of the Uniting Church:

Australian Colonial History and Culture (27-29th July) will be a course suited to those particularly from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse background or seeking AOM and introduces not only some history of our colonial history but also seeks to introduce topics such as feminism in Australia, and contemporary youth culture, and some anthropological understanding of indigenous history. Geof Lilburne and I have now run this program twice previously and attendees have found it very helpful as an introduction to our cultural identities.

Terrence Corkin will be joining us (preferably in person but at least via Zoom) for training in **congregational dynamics and church polity** towards the end of the year on 14-16th November.

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


The Church as Salt

We often hear the cry that the church is "dying" but in this book, Sally Douglas reframes this as says the church is being "purified." The empty chairs are no longer a sign of decline, but rather the removal of those for whom the church was a social club and Christianity a means to social acceptance.

In her book *Church as Salt* Sally Douglas explores this reframing in her context as a Uniting Church Minister and theologian. She uses different aspects of saltiness to explore the call to be church in our contemporary era and draws on stories of small congregations throughout Victoria to encourage readers in being the church in new ways.

Church as Salt is a light book to read and written in such a way that it can be used to promote small group discussion as a way of encouraging congregations to think about how they are the church in their context.

Australian Colonial History and Culture: Our Stories

What is our story? What is Australian culture? Australian colonial history is a story about waves of migration from around the world...

Australian Colonial History and Culture: Our Stories is a three-day intensive program designed to introduce themes in contemporary Australian society and their origins in our colonial past. Topics explored include early colonization and occupation, dispossession of indigenous people together with some anthropological discoveries, the roles of women and rise of feminism, contemporary youth culture and cultural arts in various media: art, films, poetry, stories and music. We discuss social mores, manners, communal values and why ANZAC day is important to us. We even have a session on questions which we are afraid to ask!

We discuss our awkward relationship with religion and spirituality as a shy hope in the heart, and survey colonial church history leading to the formation of the Uniting church. We look to the future implications for ministry in this context.

Who can come?

This course is part of the program for all candidates for ministry and those seeking admission as a minister of the Uniting Church. 

Theology Bites is designed as a brief introduction to theological studies. In units that take approximately 9 hours to complete, you will have a supported taster course into theology. It is designed for those who are simply curious, want to explore theology without ongoing commitment, or for local preachers who would like to develop their skills. Uniting Learning

Assessments are option if the course is NOT being used for accreditation as a Lay Preacher.
