



Welcome to SEEDS and the October edition, the season of Kambarang here in Nyungar country.

Recently I have been reading two works which complement one another:

"Strengths based leadership" from Gallup focuses on leading from your strengths. You can gain insight into your leadership strengths doing the Clifton Strengths assessment online and for a small fee they will outline for you both strengths and areas to grow in your ministry. This is one of the most well researched set of data on maximizing strengths for leadership.

The other text is "Overcoming the dark side of leadership" by McIntosh and Rima (2007 updated edition). This is a good text to follow up on our recent Ethical Ministry training day which focused on ministries that became abusive and collapsed from within. This latter text provides some helpful inner work for ministry agents to assist in overcoming potential pitfalls.

As we come into summer, I encourage you to pray for the three candidates currently undertaking Clinical Pastoral Education with Royal Perth Hospital and elsewhere, as they work through pastoral challenges and work on their skills for practical pastoral ministry and personal integration.

We remind you that **Terence Corkin** will be joining us for training in **Change and Challenge** on 14-16th November. He will be teaching days on the topics of:

Day 1: understanding and responding to conflict Day 2: working together well and Day 3: leading through change

There are still places on the *Pilgrimage to Israel* scheduled for 1-14th February, 2023 and we are seeking some more who would like to be included in this venture. We have five candidates and early graduates coming along with a further 25+ already enrolled. This will be a transformational experience in terms of understanding not just geography of Israel,

but also looking at archeological evidence for various sites, and engaging in conversation and observation of the current political context. Israel is a place of great complexity and also of fascination. When I was last there in 2011 we visited the Golan heights with views across to Syria, and walked through remnant tunnels from warfare on the border. We heard from UN peacekeepers about work with the Druze, an Islamic people group living on the border of the two nations. And in Jerusalem we saw the famous tunnel to water outside the city, thought to be associated with the invasion of David 3000 years ago. Rev Dr Ian Robinson will also be coming as second tour guide along with me and the local guides provided by Olive Tree Travel.

On 17th October will be the **Code of Ethics/Code of Conduct** (introduction) at South Perth. Please let me know as soon as possible if you would like to attend: all ministry agents and lay leaders in congregations are welcome to attend.

We look to the future of our church with hope. We aspire to bring the church into the 21st century with creativity and a contemporary mission focus. We pray for God to raise up leaders for the future of our church.

We aim to encourage, engage and empower as we work together.
