The Uniting Church National History Society was formally launched at the inaugural UCNHS Conference held in Adelaide in June 2017. Established by the Assembly of the UCA, to promote and advance the study of the history of the UCA and its predecessor churches, it seeks to complement and strengthen work already undertaken by UCA historical societies in the states and territories. It works closely with Uniting Archives, the Assembly body responsible for the archives of the UCA. The patron of the Society is the President of the Assembly.

The objects of the Society are:

- To promote and advance the study of the history of the UCA and its predecessor churches.
- To encourage and facilitate research into and publication of the history of the UCA and its predecessor churches.
- To organise conferences, public lectures and workshops.
- To establish connections with other national and international history organisations.
- To award prizes and scholarships which advance public knowledge of UCA history, including the Geoff Barnes Memorial Prize for excellence in church history.
- To draw to the attention of the Assembly significant dates, events and people in the history of the UCA and its predecessor churches, with the aspiration that appropriate resources may be provided for

their celebration of or reflection on their relevance to the contemporary life of the UCA.

• To do all things necessary, including fund-raising, to enable the UCNHS to meet its objectives.

In accordance with its constitution, the UCNHS is managed by a board elected from among its members and with power to co-opt extra members to ensure appropriate competencies. The names and contact details of the current board members are listed on this form.
