

**Minutes of the Meeting
of the Presbytery of Western Australia
at Maylands / Mt Lawley Uniting Church
on 21 March 2026**

1. Constitution

On Saturday 21 March 2026 at 9.00 am, the Presbytery of Western Australia met at Maylands Mt Lawley Uniting Church with the Chairperson, Rev Ken Devereux, chairing the meeting.

There were 28 ministers, 3 pastors, and 51 lay members present. Apologies were received from 12 ministers, 1 pastor and 13 lay members. There were 5 visitors who attended for the whole meeting and several additional guests for the special services.

2. Welcome

Robbie Muir began the meeting by lighting the Christ candle.

The Chairperson, Rev Ken Devereux, welcomed members to our meeting and to the Maylands Mt Lawley Church building and highlighted relevant amenities.

3. Opening Worship

Rev Luke Williams led the Presbytery as we began worship by singing our praise of God and offering confessions. Rev Ken Devereux then led an acknowledgement of Country and our First Peoples. Rev Steve Francis read Ezekiel 37:1-14. Rev Kim Francis highlighted that today's service seeks to emulate the café style church that is held at Maylands Mt Lawley at least once a month. Kim and Pastor Lindsay Ginn led the Presbytery in singing Dem Bones with actions! Kim asked the Presbytery "Where in the Ezekial passage do you see hope for the renewal of the church?" and members discussed this at their tables. Kim then preached about her experience visiting China and attending the baptism service of 400 adults. We were invited to reflect on Ezekiel and the power of calling on the Spirit to enable re-creation and not just relying on our own actions and planning.

Rev Ken Devereux continued worship with prayer and then led a service of induction for Rev Claire Pickering to the roles of Presbytery Officer and Presbytery Minister (Strategic Priorities) and for Rev Luke Williams to the role of Presbytery Minister (Mission). Ps Julie Ridden and Rev Ana Lea'aetoa offered a prayer and blessing for Claire and Luke on behalf of the Presbytery staff.

4. Community Building and Prayer Together

Members of Presbytery met in small groups to share about congregational life and then prayed together.

5. Meeting arrangements

The Secretary, Rev Reuben Edmonds, moved Proposal 1, which was seconded by Rev Ken Devereux.

The proposal was approved by consensus.

6. Proposal 2 Recognition of Lay Preacher

Bob French on behalf of the Candidates for Ministries Committee presented Proposal 2, which was seconded by Rev Andy Broadbent, and invited Pepe to address the Presbytery.

That the WA Presbytery agrees:

To recognise Pepetaufoou (Pepe) Luivaie Halatau as a Lay Preacher and request the Chairperson of Presbytery to arrange for this to be recognised in a service of worship, including presentation of a Certificate of Recognition as a Lay Preacher.

The meeting then broke for morning tea.

7. Secret Ballot on Proposal 2

No questions were asked of CMC in relation to the proposal. The Presbytery voted on the proposal via secret ballot.

After the scrutineers counted the votes, it was announced that the proposal had received the two thirds majority required and Proposal 2 was passed. Rev Elaine Ledgerwood led the Presbytery in prayer for Pepe.

8. Chairperson's Report

Past chairperson, Alison Xamon, took the chair.

Rev Ken Devereux presented his report.

Ken gave an overview of his report and a snapshot of the breadth of the Presbytery. He also reflected on changes underway in our Presbytery.

The report was received by consensus.

The chairperson, Rev Ken Devereux, resumed the chair.

9. Treasurer's Report

Janine McDonald, Presbytery Treasurer, presented her report.

Janine gave an overview of the 2025 finances including the overall result of a deficit of approximately \$36,000. Members are encouraged to check their congregation is contributing to Mission and Service and thanks were offered for those congregations that are giving regularly, those that are increasing their giving, those that offer additional one-off payments, and those that give above the 10% guideline. Members are also encouraged to ensure their congregation is sending a copy of their audited 2025 finances to the Presbytery Treasurer.

The report was received by consensus.

10. Candidates for Ministries Committee

Bob French, member of CMC, presented the report.

Bob highlighted that the Called By Name booklet has been sent out to all congregations and CMC would love to hear how it has been received. There is also a need for more mentors for people undertaking a Period of Discernment or a Candidate for Ordination. CMC is also looking for more members, in particular a member from a culturally and or linguistically diverse background.

A member of Presbytery asked a question about the process for pairing up mentors with PODs. Bob explained that consideration is given on a case-by-case basis as to the best mentor for a candidate given the pool of available candidates.

The report was received by consensus.

The meeting then broke for morning tea.

11. Thrive Mission Committee report

Rev Stephen van Schalkwyk, member of Thrive, presented the report.

Stephen highlighted the work of Thrive in undertaking listening journeys. He also highlighted the upcoming National Church Life Survey (NCLS) and that Thrive has offered a 50% contribution towards the registration fee for congregations. The more congregations that undertake the NCLS the better for our whole church. He also highlighted the work that has been undertaken to prepare grant applications for additional Presbytery training.

The report was received by consensus.

12. Presbytery Property Committee report

No member of PPC could attend to present the report. A comprehensive document outlining guidelines for congregations about property use and maintenance will be distributed shortly.

The report was received by consensus.

13. Committee for Education for Discipleship and Leadership (CEDAL) report

Dr Karen Flowers, chair of CEDAL, presented the report.

Karen gave thanks for Rev Ruth Vertigan who began part time supply this semester and asked for prayer for the Joint Nominating Committee (JNC) as it considers applications for the position of Formation and Learning Culture Coordinator. Karen also highlighted the work of Uniting Centre for Education and Formation and highlighted the upcoming guest in residence.

A member of Presbytery asked if workshops by the guest in residence would be accessible online for members from the regions. Karen indicated that where possible this would be made available.

The report was received by consensus.

14. Pastoral Relations Committee report

Rev Ivan Clark, member of PRC, presented the report.

Ivan highlighted that much of the work of PRC is confidential and cannot be reported and so acknowledged that the work in the report is just the tip of the iceberg. He highlighted that the request for ministers to complete their annual reports will be going out soon and encouraged ministers to complete them. Congregations are also encouraged to submit their annual reports.

A member of Presbytery asked about how PRC follows up on ministers who do not complete reports. Ivan responded that Church Councils would be informed if a minister has not completed their report and a minister's profile will include a Presbytery comment about recent completion of reports.

The report was received by consensus.

15. Proposal 3 Recognition of Faith Community

Sue Strutt, moved Proposal 3, which was seconded by Rev Ivan Clark.

That the WA Presbytery agrees:

- 1. to recognise the worshipping community in Tammin as a Uniting Aboriginal and Islander Christian Congress Faith Community of the Uniting Church in Australia Presbytery of WA according to Regulation 3.9.2.; and***
- 2. to welcome and encourage this new Faith Community to the life and witness of the Presbytery of WA.***

The proposal was approved by consensus.

16. Intercultural Network report

Rev Judy Sanderson, convenor, presented the report.

Judy highlighted the collaboration with the Rural and Remote Ministry Network to run a workshop to help congregations connect with CALD communities. Judy also highlighted the upcoming workshop on Friday the 19th of June to further develop how all congregations can be intercultural by highlighting and respecting our differences.

Judy also raised that the Karen Baptists, who currently worship at Ross Memorial UC, are seeking a new home for their worship services with a preference for a location in the eastern suburbs.

The report was received by consensus.

17. Rural and Remote Ministry Network report

Yuko Tonai-Moore, convenor, and Rev Craig Bosman, Rural Resource Minister, presented the report.

Yuko spoke about an upcoming workshop on how congregations can be welcoming for new arrivals and visitors. She also highlighted and expressed appreciation for the recent workshops on how to lead a funeral.

The report was received by consensus.

18. Strategic Priorities Report

Rev Claire Pickering, Presbytery Minister (Strategic Priorities), presented the report.

Claire gave an overview of the objectives of the working group and leaders.

Rev Claire Pickering is leading the work on Objective 1: Identifying and resourcing Congregations and Faith Communities that have the potential to engage in effective ministry and mission. Rev Luke Williams and Rev Ana Lea'aetoa are leading the work on Objective 2: Developing a strategic plan for new and renewed forms of ministry and the effective deployment of ministry agents to these settings. Rev Luke and Rev Andy Broadbent are leading the work on Objective 3: Resourcing lay and ordained leaders with high quality education and formation. Sue Strutt is leading the work on Objective 4: Promoting a culture of being intergenerational and intercultural in our Congregations and Faith Communities. Heather Hamblin is leading the work on Objective 5: Developing a strategic plan for properties which are prioritised due to their strategic missional location.

Claire spoke about the revised Health and Vitality Toolkit and the changes that have been implemented. She hopes that the updated questions and self-assessment will lead to meaningful conversations in our congregations. A returned toolkit will better enable the Presbytery to prioritise its work and engagement with congregations. All congregations and faith communities are encouraged to complete the toolkit as soon as possible. Last year 25 congregations returned the original toolkit and Claire gave thanks for those who did. These congregations are still encouraged to complete the updated toolkit if possible.

Rev Luke Williams and Rev Ana Lea'aetoa spoke about the forms of ministry and leadership in our Presbytery. These forms include established congregational placements and positions, non-congregational ministry positions (such as chaplains and Presbytery Ministers), and emerging forms of ministry leadership. Luke and Ana offered three different examples of emerging ministry. Resource churches that feature multiple ministry agents and seek to support, revitalise and plant new congregations. Revitalisation journeys where smaller congregations are invited into collaboration and clusters with the assistance of interim ministry. Legacy where congregations discern a need to move into a new way of being with resources being gifted to the wider church. Luke highlighted that church plants are essential, but they are most likely to succeed when planted by existing congregations. Luke encouraged members and congregations to reach out to the Presbytery to begin the conversations, they do not need to wait for the Presbytery to reach out.

The report was received by consensus.

19. Conclusion of Placement Service

Rev David Jackson, Moderator of Synod of WA, led a service to mark the conclusion of Rev Mitch Fialkowski from his placement as Frontier Services Remote Area Ministry (Murchison-Meekatharra) which marks his retirement from active ministry. In the presence of Mitch's family members, David gave an overview of Mitch's ministry and gave thanks especially for his long ministry with Frontier Services. Members present offered a standing ovation for Mitch's long ministry and service to God. Mitch reflected on his ministry and gave thanks for the community of Meekatharra and the region he served. Rev Lindsay Cullen, Associate General Secretary of the Assembly and board member of Frontier Services brought greetings and gave thanks for Mitch.

The Presbytery broke for lunch after Tevita Naroba said grace.

20. Commissioning Service

Rev David Jackson, Moderator of WA Synod, led a commissioning service for David Beards to the role of General Secretary of Synod of WA. David Beards, an active member of Maylands/Mt Lawley, gave thanks for the commissioning and trust of the Synod. He spoke to Presbytery members and guests of looking forward to working with the Synod of WA, Congress, the Assembly, the Presbytery of WA, our congregations & faith communities, our schools, and our agencies.

21. Meet the Moderator

Rev David Jackson, Moderator of WA Synod spoke about his vision for his term as Moderator and the Uniting Church in WA. David also spoke about the work he has undertaken since becoming Moderator and the work planned for the months ahead.

22. Presentation and Discussion

Rev Lindsay Cullen, Associate General Secretary of the Assembly, and Rev Dr Sunny Chen, National Consultant of the Assembly Resourcing Unit, presented to the Presbytery. Lindsay brought greetings to the Presbytery on behalf of President Rev Charissa Suli and Assembly General Secretary Andrew Johnson. Sunny presented on the work of Act 2, the work that has been undertaken thus far, and where the process is heading. All the information can be found on the new website www.act2uca.com.

A member of Presbytery raised the limitations of lay presiding to single locations and the impact this has on the ministry of lay presiders. Lindsay highlighted that the national Lay Preachers Association submitted a paper exploring this issue and it will be considered as part of the review.

A member of Presbytery raised the constraints of ratios for membership of councils. Lindsay responded that the assembly are seeking to embed greater flexibility for councils of the church to enable participation of people with the appropriate diversity of gifts and skills.

A member of Presbytery raised a query about church membership. Lindsay highlighted the desire is to give local communities the flexibility to define what active membership in their context looks like while retaining the foundational requirement of baptism.

A member of Presbytery reflected on the theological nature of membership and their concerns about the minimum expectations of understanding about the beliefs of the Uniting Church that are needed for membership. Lindsay responded that a local community would have the flexibility to set the expectations they believed were appropriate, including understanding of Uniting Church beliefs.

23. Uniting Generations Network report

Rev Sione Lea'aetoa, convenor, and Pastor Julie Ridden, Children, Families, Youth and Young Adult Co-ordinator, presented the report.

Sione highlighted the challenges of getting people to engage with the network through its meetings. Julie highlighted the ongoing work of the working group that is reviewing the model that frames the work of our ministry with young people. She also highlighted several workshops that congregations can request to have at their congregation.

The report was received by consensus.

24. National Church Life Survey (NCLS) Highlight

Rev Luke Williams presented on the upcoming NCLS this year. Luke spoke about the benefits the survey results provide for congregations and the wider church and encouraged all congregations to participate. He reminded members that Thrive is offering a 50% contribution to the registration fees for congregations.

Julie highlighted that there are surveys for 8-14 year olds alongside the standard survey for teenagers and adults.

25. Proposal 4 – Holy Week 2026

Rev Luke Williams, moved Proposal 4, which was seconded by Rev Ana Lea'aetoa.

Luke reflected on the challenges facing our church and the temptation to blame something external as the reason for our challenges. Rather than an accusation, he offers this proposal as an invitation into a time of internal reflection rather than blame and division.

A member of Presbytery asked about the way in which the Presbytery can meet this commitment. Luke responded that all members of Presbytery are invited to respond to this proposal in their own time and through their congregations.

A member of Presbytery reflected on their previous experiences of Presbytery meetings and spoke in support of the heart of the proposal. Luke reminded members this is not about pointing fingers but an opportunity to reflect and hopefully transform.

A member of Presbytery spoke in support of the proposal and gave thanks for the proposers bringing this forward.

A member of Presbytery requested the addition of the word “wherever” after grieving in the proposal. The Presbytery agreed by consensus to include this amendment.

The amended proposal was put to the meeting:

That the WA Presbytery commits:

to approaching the coming Holy Week as a season of corporate repentance — grieving wherever the breakdown of relationships across our Synod, Presbytery and Congregations, confessing our own participation in patterns of blame, bitterness and ungracious speech, and seeking by God’s grace to move forward with mercy, humility and renewed love for one another.

The amended proposal was approved by consensus.

26. Proposal 5 – Climate Action

Past chairperson, Alison Xamon, took the chair.

Rev Ken Devereux, moved Proposal 5, which was seconded by Rev Sophia Lizares.

Ken spoke about the importance of our responsibility to respond to climate change and to reaffirm our commitment to our community.

A member of Presbytery requested the removal of the words “who could be willing” from clause (d). The Presbytery accepted the amendment.

In light of the amendment, A member of Presbytery requested a change of “to contact” in clause (d) to the words “by contacting”. The Presbytery accepted the amendment.

The amended proposal was put to the meeting:

That the WA Presbytery reaffirms:

that the Presbytery joins with Synod in sharing the broad commitment of the Uniting Church in Australia to address climate change, by

- a) encouraging Ministers, Church Councils, Congregations and Faith Communities, to join with Presbytery staff and Committees in monitoring incoming guidance on related matters;***
- b) doing what they can to promote considerations of environmental impacts and planning that will enable us to reduce our greenhouse gas emissions to net-zero within about 10 years;***
- c) recognizing that our responsibilities as stewards of God's creation relate to worship, pastoral care, education, mission, social justice, property, finances and public engagement with the wider society;***
- d) by encouraging people to contribute to a re-constituted Net-Zero Steering Group for the Uniting Church in Western Australia by contacting Rev Ken Devereux or the General-Secretary of Synod at general.secretary@wa.uca.org.au; and***
- e) by promoting the Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty along with many other faith-based communities around Australia and around the world this year.***

The amended proposal was approved by consensus.

The chairperson, Rev Ken Devereux, resumed the chair.

27. Time of Sharing

Members were invited to share at their tables about what they have heard in the meeting today.

Tevita Naroba spoke to the Presbytery about the upcoming Fijian National Conference being held in October 2026 in Fremantle and gave thanks for the support of the Synod and Presbytery. He is looking forward to meeting with Fijians from around the country.

Ps John Tompkins, Bob Lockley, and Mary Elton who joined the meeting by zoom each spoke briefly about their appreciation for the meeting and gave an update of ministry in their congregations.

Rev Sophia Lizares, co-chair of the Filipino National Conference, alerted members that the Filipino National conference is also being held this year in Sydney and Sophia asks members to alert any Filipino members they have in their congregations to get into contact with her about the possibility of attending.

28. Thanks

Rev Ken Devereux thanked Maylands Mt Lawley Uniting Church for hosting today's meeting, and the staff and many volunteers who helped enable today's Presbytery meeting.


29. Closing Prayer
